### **SPA Buddy Scheme Role Description**

#### Your Role:

Your role is to offer pastoral support to a group of first year students and help them to feel more settled at the University of Exeter. You will need to make regular contact with them for at least the first term and offer them guidance about wider support services at the University where needed (e.g. SID, Wellbeing, relevant College and departmental staff).

You are **not** expected to act as a counsellor, personal tutor or help them with their academic work.

## **Key Duties:**

- Meet face-to-face with mentees at least once a fortnight (note: some mentees might need more regular contact to help them settle).
- Contact the project co-ordinator (Alice Chalk) regularly and inform them of any arising issues.

# **Personal Requirements:**

- Empathy and a willingness to listen.
- Knowing the boundaries of the role; what support you are expected to provide and when you should seek further support.
- Subject-specific knowledge of the Sociology/Philosophy/Anthropology department.
- Awareness of a diverse range of backgrounds.

Provide answers to any basic enquiries such as 'Teach' your mentees or help them with interpreting timetables, finding their way around assignments or study. (But you can give tips on campus, shopping and entertainment in Exeter study skills and direct them to relevant services, etc. e.g. study skills advisors).
